CHAPTER 1

TELECOMMUNICATION SERVICES

The provisions of the EU legal acts listed in this Chapter shall, for the purposes of this Agreement, be read with the following adaptation:

Article 3 of Framework Protocol 1 to this Agreement shall apply. The period referred to in Article 3(2) of Framework Protocol 1 shall be a period of seven years from the date of entry into force of this Agreement.

The provisions of this Regulation shall, for the purposes of this Agreement, be read with the following adaptations:

- (a) Modalities for the association of Andorra in accordance with Article 80(7) of this Agreement:

The national regulatory authorities of Andorra with primary responsibility for overseeing the day-to-day operation of the markets for electronic communications networks and services shall participate fully in the work of the Board of Regulators of BEREC, the working groups of BEREC and the Management Board of the BEREC Office.

They shall be represented at an appropriate level in accordance with the provisions of the BEREC Regulation.

To that effect, the national regulatory authorities of Andorra shall have the same rights and obligations as the national regulatory authorities of the EU Member States, except for the right to vote. Members from Andorra shall not be eligible for the Chairmanship of the Board of Regulators and of the Management Board.

BEREC and the BEREC Office shall, as and when appropriate, assist the national regulatory authorities of Andorra in the performance of their tasks.

(b) In Article 4:

(i) the following paragraph shall be inserted:

"1a. The positions of the national regulatory authorities of the Associated State shall be recorded separately by BEREC when issuing opinions in accordance with paragraph 1 point (c)(i) and (ii)."

(ii) in paragraph 4, the words "relevant Union law" shall read "the Association Agreement".

(c) The following paragraph shall be added in Article 25:

"5. Andorra shall participate in the contribution from the EU referred to in paragraph 3 point (a). For this purpose, the procedures laid down in Article 68 of the Framework Agreement and the Andorra Protocol shall apply *mutatis mutandis*."

(d) In Article 30, the following subparagraphs shall be added:

"By way of derogation from Articles 12(2)(a) and 82(3)(a) of the Conditions of Employment of Other Servants of the European Union, nationals of Andorra enjoying their full rights as citizens may be engaged under contract by the recruitment authority of the Agency.

By way of derogation from Articles 12(2)(e), 82(3)(e) and 85(3) of the Conditions of Employment of Other Servants of the European Union, the languages referred to in Article 111 of the Association Agreement shall be considered by the Office, in respect of its staff, as languages of the Union referred to in Article 55(1) of the Treaty on European Union."

- (e) The following shall be added in Article 34:

"Andorra shall grant privileges and immunities to the BEREC Office equivalent to those contained in the Protocol on Privileges and Immunities of the European Union."

- (f) The following paragraph shall be added in Article 36:

"4. Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 30 May 2001 regarding public access to European Parliament, Council and Commission documents shall, for the application of the Regulation, apply to the national regulatory authorities of Andorra in regard to documents prepared by BEREC or the BEREC Office."

The following paragraphs shall be added after the second paragraph of Article 24:

'This Regulation shall enter into force in Andorra as from the end of the transition period referred to in Annex XI, Chapter 3, of the Andorra Protocol to the Association Agreement, unless estimated costs of Andorra's operator(s) for wholesale roaming services for a specific year, according to the Commission cost model, are above the maximum wholesale charges set out by this Regulation for that year.

The first verification shall be carried out at the initiative of the European Commission not later than four years ahead of the end of the transition period referred to in the previous paragraph. Subsequent verifications can be initiated by the European Commission not later than one year before the end of the transition period.

For the purposes of the two previous paragraphs, the Andorran authorities shall closely cooperate with the Commission, or any entity working on its behalf, by providing all relevant and necessary data to feed the Commission cost model, from the day of entry into force of the Agreement mentioned in the third paragraph of this Article.'
